What HUNTERS Need to Know About Chronic Wasting Disease

- Know where you're hunting and whether CWD has been found in the area.
- Work with landowners and your neighbors to manage deer densities on private lands through legal hunting.
- Submit samples from deer harvested near previous positive detections to make informed consumption decisions.
- Never concentrate deer around feed or minerals.
- Dispose of carcasses in a landfill or at the site where it was harvested.
- Continue to hunt safe, sharing your passion and knowledge.

All hunters have a critical role to play in the management of CWD.

What LANDOWNERS Need to Know About Chronic Wasting Disease

- Work with hunters to manage your deer herd through legal harvest.
- Never concentrate deer around feed or minerals.
- Report sick deer to your local DNR wildlife biologist or conservation officer.
- Discuss CWD and deer management with your neighbors.
- Learn the status of CWD in your area and remember healthy looking deer can still shed and spread CWD.
